



## ESTIMATED COST OF ATTENDANCE FOR INTERNATIONAL UNDERGRADUATE STUDENTS (2024-2025 Academic Year) in U.S. dollars

The budgets shown below are *estimated* amounts undergraduate international students may expect to pay for costs for the 2024/2025 academic year (2 semesters/10 months). In addition to the **direct** costs of tuition/fees, room and board, and health insurance, estimates are provided for the **indirect** costs of books and supplies, miscellaneous and personal expenses.

<b>Room &amp; Board</b> (average cost of On & Off-campus housing and meals)	<b>\$12,000</b>
<b>Health Insurance</b> (health insurance is mandatory for ALL students)	<b>\$3,000</b>
<b>Estimated Indirect Costs</b> (books/supplies: \$2,000, miscellaneous: \$2,000, & personal expenses: \$3,000)	<b>\$7,000</b>
<b>TOTAL</b>	<b>\$47,000</b>

F-2 dependents are defined as a spouse or an unmarried minor child under 21 years of age of an F-1 student. F-1 students must submit additional financial support to invite a spouse or unmarried children to join them at UNC Charlotte by providing \$6,000 per spouse & \$3,600 per each child.

\*Mandatory tuition, fees and tuition increments are assessed based on full course enrollment each fall and spring semester. Tuition and fees are established annually by the General Assembly of the State of North Carolina and by the N.C. General Administration. The amounts shown above are the best estimates available; final costs are usually determined in August each year prior to the beginning of the fall semester. As with any college or university, the indirect/unbilled costs (supplies, entertainment, dependent costs, clothing, transportation, vacations, etc) will vary depending on each student's lifestyle.
